RESOLUTION APPROVING WARDS IN THE TOWN OF PRAIRIE LAKE AFTER THE 2020 CENSUS

WHEREAS, §5.15 Wis. Stats. provides that the governing body of a municipality shall by resolution create wards, and whereas §5.15(2)(b)(4) Wis. Stats. states that "In any city, village or town in which the population is less than 10,000, each ward shall contain not less than 300 nor more than 1,000 inhabitants." And whereas the population of the Town of Prairie Lake was reported to be 1,648 at the 2020 census

- **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that heretofore the Town of Prairie Lake will be divided into two wards, and that these two wards have the common boundary of USH 53 as the demarcation point, and further that **Ward 1** shall be the area north and east of said USH 53 and that **Ward 2** shall be the area south and west of said USH 53. And let it be known that these two wards are nearly equal in population with Ward I having 846 inhabitants and Ward 2 having 802 inhabitants. Further, that since the Town of Prairie Lake is wholly within one county supervisory district, this division accords with §5.15(2)(d) Wis. Stats. in that it does not obstruct or otherwise impair the creation of the county supervisory districts. The polling place for both said Wards 1 and 2 shall be the Meeting Room of the Municipal Building located at 796 21st Street.
